SACRAMENTS

Baptism

Baptism is celebrated after consultation with the parish staff as to date. Registered membership in the parish and attendance at a Baptism Class are required for all parents prior to their first child's Baptism.

Holy Communion

A two-year required sacramental preparation process begins in the first grade. It culminates in the celebration of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion in the second grade.

Confirmation

A two-year required sacramental preparation process begins in the sixth/seventh grade. It culminates in the celebration of Confirmation.

Matrimony

A six-month required sacramental preparation process begins when the engaged couple meets with the priest or deacon and culminates in the couple's exchange of consent on their wedding day.

Rite of Christian

Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

A one-year process for preparation and study is required for all those interested in becoming Catholic.

CHAPTER SEVEN: GATHERING AREA: PART 2 (continued)

Set of Etched Windows on the West Wall:

(These windows were original to the building, but when the windows were replaced they were not able to be used in the windows. We are working to have them displayed in the Narthax)

Exiting the Gospel Doors and going to the left (South) you will see a set of etched windows. The top four spaces represent Acts 2:24. This DESCRIPTION OF THE CHURCH is depicted with a scroll, for the teaching of the Apostles; interlocking rings to symbolize the communal life; the broken host for the breaking of bread; and the smoking incense burner to call to mind the prayers.

The larger spaces below represent the seasons of the LITURGICAL YEAR.

ADVENT: The alpha and omega on a cloud descending to earth reflect the dual nature of Advent's expectation. The primary sense of the season is to prepare us for the Second Coming of Jesus manifested in the Alpha and Omega coming to earth on the clouds of heaven. The related theme is to get a sense of the Old Testament prophecies of His coming Incarnation and Birth. The image is inspired by the ancient Advent Hymn, *Rotate Coeli*, which begins with the line "O heavens, open from above that the clouds may rain down the Just One."

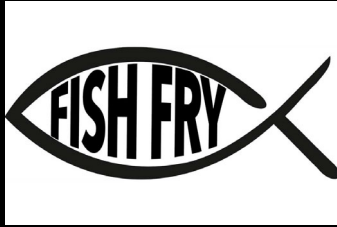
CHRISTMAS: The next window has a star at the top. This unique image is the Star of David, representing St. Joseph who adopted Jesus into the House of David. It is surmounted with the image of Mary called the Mystical Rose. From the Mother and the Foster Father rays fall upon a manger with a Halo. This unique style of a halo, the one with a cross through it, is proper only to Jesus.

LENT: The next window depicts a glorified cross marked with images of the five Holy Wounds of Jesus as well as an image of the crown of thorns, lance, and the reed with the sponge, and the three nails. Lent reminds us that to be ready to rise with Christ we must be ready to die with Him.

EASTER: This window centers on the Lamb once slain who lives forever with a banner of victory, namely the cross. The Lamb is standing on a book with seven ribbons which calls to mind the sacramental life of the Church which is rooted in the Paschal Mystery. Descending on the Lamb is the Holy Spirit, reminding us that the point of the Paschal Mystery, the Death and Resurrection of the Lord, is our participation in God's Life through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit (II Per 1:4).

HISTORY PANES

The pane of the far left depicts a shield representing the parish with the Cross of St. Andrew (an "X" shape) and the net of evangelization. Next to it is the Coat of Arms of the Diocese of Lexington with its crown for Christ the King, the hints of mountains and streams, and Our Lady. The next window holds the Coat of Arms of Bishop J. Kendrick Williams who dedicated this building, making it a Catholic Church. His shield combines with the one of the Diocese. On his side, there is an arrowhead honoring his Cherokee ancestry, a shell for St. James his patron saint, the rampant Lion symbols of the Williams family, the hills and water ways of Central and Eastern Kentucky, and an emblem of Mary, the fleur de lis, symbol of the Archdiocese of Louisville. The fourth coat of arms is that of St. John Paul II, an "M" for Mary rests below the arm of her Son and Savior's Cross. It was during his pontificate that the church was dedicated.
