SACRAMENTS

Baptism

Baptism is celebrated after consultation with the parish staff as to date. Registered membership in the parish and attendance at a Baptism Class are required for all parents prior to their first child's Baptism.

Holy Communion

A two-year required sacramental preparation process begins in the first grade. It culminates in the celebration of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion in the second grade.

Confirmation

A two-year required sacramental preparation process begins in the sixth/seventh grade. It culminates in the celebration of Confirmation.

Matrimony

A six-month required sacramental preparation process begins when the engaged couple meets with the priest or deacon and culminates in the couple's exchange of consent on their wedding day.

Rite of Christian

Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

A one-year process for preparation and study is required for all those interested in becoming Catholic.

SEEING THE LIGHT

Our Lenten journey continues this Sunday as we hear of Jesus healing a blind man in the Gospel of John. Jesus proclaims himself the light of the world, a light that overcomes darkness and enables a new capacity to see. The man, blind from birth, was able to begin his path to sight by first acknowledging his blindness. We are reminded of God's ongoing invitation to us to journey from blindness to sight. We begin by acknowledging our own capacity for "blind spots," and so open ourselves to uncomfortable truths and to God's healing. We are invited to see beyond appearances, as the reading from Samuel indicates, and to look into the heart of things. We are invited to "live as children of light" as the letter to the Ephesians teaches. Like the man healed from blindness, we may gradually learn to see fully and to follow Jesus.

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VER LA LUZ

Nuestro viaje cuaresmal continúa este domingo cuando escuchamos a Jesús curar a un ciego en el Evangelio de Juan. Jesús se proclama luz del mundo, una luz que vence las tinieblas y permite una nueva capacidad de ver. El hombre, ciego de nacimiento, pudo iniciar su camino hacia la vista reconociendo primero su ceguera. Se nos recuerda que Dios nos invita continuamente a pasar de la ceguera a la vista. Empezamos por reconocer nuestra propia capacidad de "puntos ciegos", y así nos abrimos a verdades incómodas y a la curación de Dios. Se nos invita a ver más allá de las apariencias, como indica la lectura de Samuel, y a mirar en el corazón de las cosas. Se nos invita a "vivir como hijos de la luz", como enseña la carta a los Efesios. Como el hombre curado de la ceguera, podemos aprender gradualmente a ver plenamente y a seguir a Jesús.

CHAPTER EIGHT: BLESSED SACRAMENTAL CHAPEL (Continued)

Think private devotion and adoration.

Window



The stained-glass window in the inside door behind the steel gates given by the Building Committee for this church depicting the Bell Tower and the inviting motto of the parish and the project: "All Are Welcome." A song by that title was the theme song of the building campaign for the 2001 church.

Tabernacle



Step inside and immediately you are drawn to the pillar tabernacle constructed in large part from the center spire of an altar piece donated by Fr. Paul Volk in 1893. It came from Germany. The paint is still original! This re-configuration was done for the 1977 church at the direction of Fr. Stanley Osbourne.

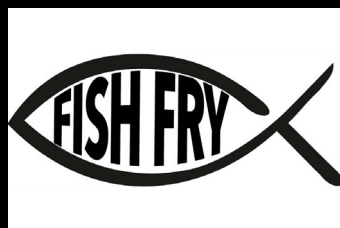
On either side of the pillar tabernacle are two faceted stained-glass windows depicting salvation history. In the upper left-hand window is the Alpha, below it is the sun and stars recalling creation. Then the tablets of the Law are represented. The scroll, feather pen, and the tongs with a burning ember remind us of the prophets. On the other side, starting at the bottom is a manger surmounted with a Chi Rho. the Holy Spirit is shown as a dove descending on the Christ symbol which is surrounded by blue wavy lines recalling the baptism in the Jordan, the beginning of the ministry of Jesus. Above that

you can find symbols of the passion, especially the cross. Above that is a phoenix symbolizing the resurrection. Above the phoenix is the Omega. (Fenestra Studios)

The Sanctuary Lamp

The hanging Sanctuary Lamp (Buddy Fister creation) hangs from the center of the ceiling and is fitted with pulleys so it can be lowered to replace the candle. No modern tools were used to forge this fine hand wrought piece. It is sign of the constant devotion we should have to the Presence of Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Like the lamps in the Holy of Holies of the Old Testament it burns constantly, except when the blessed Sacraments are not present.

The altar and the ambo in this chapel are from sections from the same altar piece. These were fashioned during Fr. Stanley Osbourne's efforts to build the church that served the parish from 1977 - 2001. The presider's chair is from the Monastery of Gethsemane and the pews are from St. Catherine's College in Springfield. Fr. Osbourne also added these to our parish.

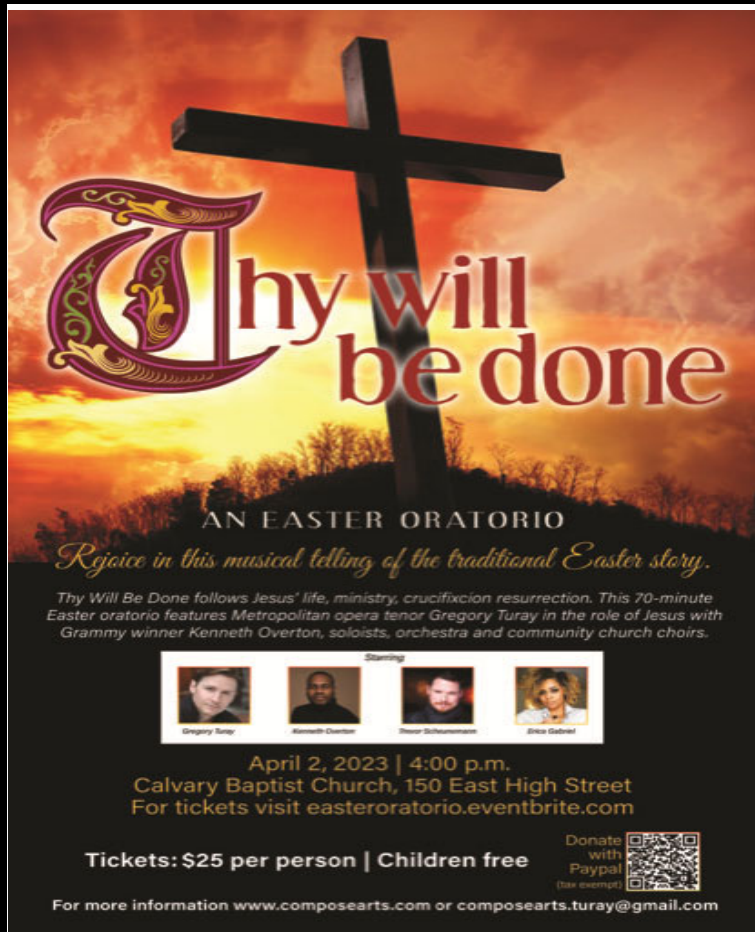

Rejoice in this musical telling of the traditional Easter story.

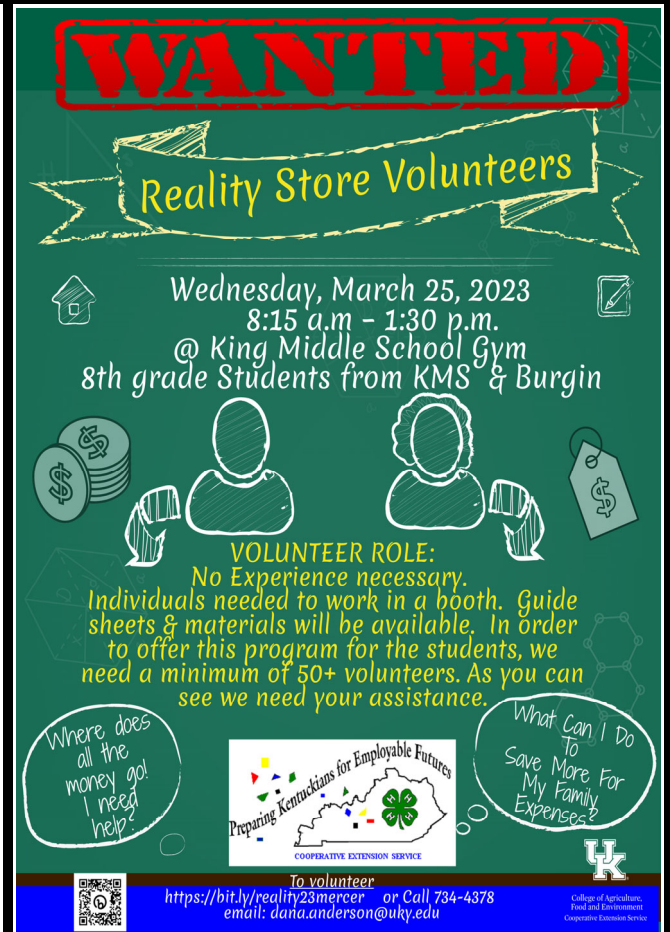
