SACRAMENTS

Baptism

Baptism is celebrated after consultation with the parish staff as to date. Registered membership in the parish and attendance at a Baptism Class are required for all parents prior to their first child's Baptism.

Holy Communion

A two-year required sacramental preparation process begins in the first grade. It culminates in the celebration of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion in the second grade.

Confirmation

A two-year required sacramental preparation process begins in the sixth/seventh grade. It culminates in the celebration of Confirmation.

Matrimony

A six-month required sacramental preparation process begins when the engaged couple meets with the priest or deacon and culminates in the couple's exchange of consent on their wedding day.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

A one-year process for preparation and study is required for all those interested in becoming Catholic.

BUT WHEN THE KING RETURNED TO HIS EVIL WAYS, SAINT STANISLAUS EXCOMMUNICATED HIM.

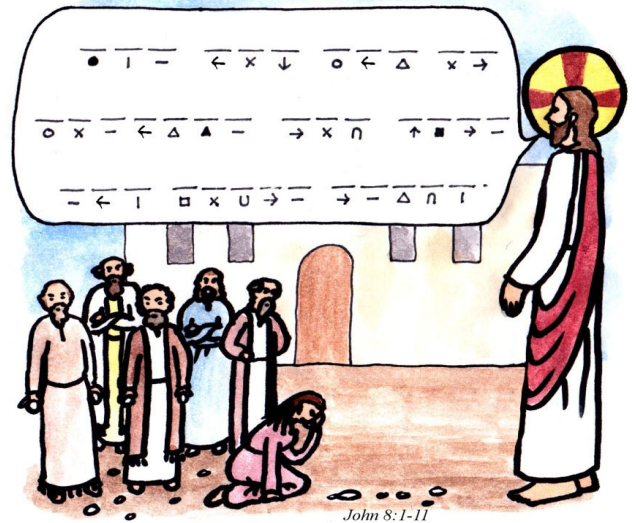

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus
Are You Ready to Let Go?
As we enter the Fifth Week of Lent, the Church invites us to look deeper into our hearts and ask a profound question: What am I still holding onto that keeps me from fully surrendering to God? In this Sunday's Gospel, we hear about Lazarus being raised from the dead (John 1:1-45).



Jesus arrives at the tomb and commands, "Lazarus, come out!" But before Lazarus can be freed, the stone must be rolled away. This powerful moment reflects our own spiritual journey — sometimes God wants to raise us to new life, but first, we must be willing to roll away the stone that keeps us bound. What is the stone in your life that blocks you from experiencing the fullness of God's grace? Is it unforgiveness, pride, anger, addiction, or fear? Like Lazarus, we may find ourselves trapped in our own tomb, yet Jesus stands outside, calling us to freedom. This week, I encourage you to take this question to prayer: What do I need to let go of to fully encounter God's love and freedom? As Lent draws closer to Holy Week, may we have the courage to surrender everything that weighs us down, trusting that Jesus can raise us from spiritual death to new life. Are you ready to let go and step into the light of Christ?

May God's grace lead us to experience the freedom of true resurrection.
