## SACRAMENTS

### Baptism

Baptism is celebrated after consultation with the parish staff as to date. Registered membership in the parish and attendance at a Baptism Class are required for all parents prior to their first child's Baptism.

### Holy Communion

A two-year required sacramental preparation process begins in the first grade. It culminates in the celebration of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion in the second grade.

### Confirmation

A two-year required sacramental preparation process begins in the sixth/seventh grade. It culminates in the celebration of Confirmation.

### Matrimony

A six-month required sacramental preparation process begins when the engaged couple meets with the priest or deacon and culminates in the couple's exchange of consent on their wedding day.

### Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

A one-year process for preparation and study is required for all those interested in becoming Catholic.

# Holy Week

Today is the beginning of Holy Week, when we specially remember the last days of Jesus and His death on the cross.

The Sunday before Jesus died, He came riding into Jerusalem on a donkey. All the people cheered for Him. They laid down their cloaks and palm branches on the road to honour Him. That was Palm Sunday.

On the first Holy Thursday Jesus offered the first Mass ever. He took bread and wine and changed them into His Body and Blood and gave them to His Apostles to eat and drink. The same thing happens at every Mass when the priest says Jesus' words at the Consecration. We don't see the bread or wine change, but they are still really Jesus, offering Himself to God for us.

Good Friday is the day that Jesus died on the cross. The leaders of the Jews got the people to turn against Him. After an unfair trial, Jesus was whipped harshly and made to carry a cross up a hill. Then He was nailed to the cross and hung there until He died. Only His mother and a few of His friends were with Him.

Jesus was God and could have stopped the people from killing Him, but He chose to die for you. Because we sin, we don't deserve to go to Heaven. Jesus died to take the punishment for our sins so that we could go to Heaven. That's why it's called "Good" Friday! What is something special you can do on Good Friday to make up for your sins and say "thank you" to Jesus?

On Good Friday morning, JESUS, who had been arrested the night before, was judged by Pontius Pilate, the ROMAN governor. Pilate had him WHIPPED. Then to make fun of Him the SOLDIERS made a CROWN of THORNS and put it on His head. They threw a purple cloth on Him and beat Him with RODS, saying, "Hail, KING of the JEWS!" Then Pilate had Jesus brought out in front of the people and asked them what they wanted to do with Him. The people, who had welcomed Him into JERUSALEM a few days before with their HOSANNAS, now shouted that He should be crucified.

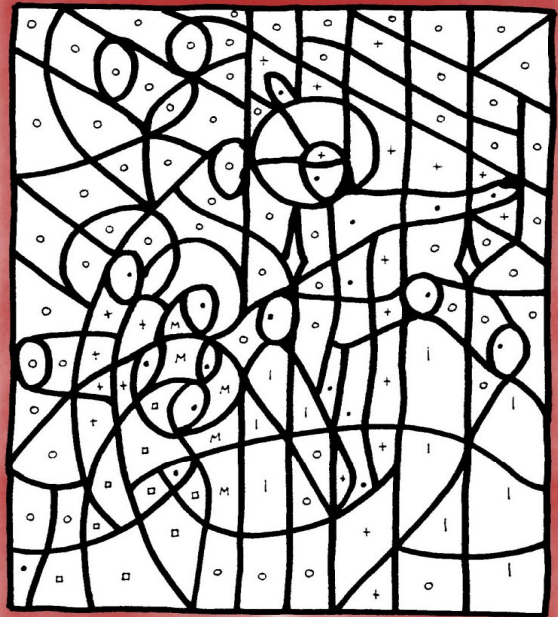
So Jesus was made to CARRY a heavy CROSS out of the city and up a big HILL. Because He was so weak from being beaten, a man named SIMON of Cyrene was forced to help Him. The soldiers tore off Jesus' CLOTHES and attached Him to the cross with NAILS through His hands and feet.

Jesus offered His life for our SINS. He hung on the cross for three HOURS until He DIED. Nearby were His mother MARY, JOHN the Apostle, and Mary MAGDALEN. After He died a soldier stuck a SPEAR into His side to be sure He was dead.

Did you know that at every MASS we re-offer Jesus' sacrifice on the cross in an unbloody way on the altar?

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus

As we enter Palm Sunday, we begin the most sacred and solemn week of the liturgical year — Holy Week. Today, we commemorate Jesus’ triumphant entry into Jerusalem, where people welcomed Him with palm branches, shouting “Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!” Yet, within days, the same crowd would shout, “Crucify Him!” This week invites us to pause and reflect: Where do I stand in my faith-journey? Am I like the crowd that welcomes Jesus in joy but abandons Him in times of difficulty? Do I truly recognize Jesus as my Lord and King, or do I set Him aside when life gets tough? As we journey through Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil, let us enter deeply into the Passion of Christ. Reflect on the unconditional love Jesus demonstrated on the cross. He was rejected, betrayed, and crucified — yet He still chose to forgive. Can I offer the same forgiveness to those who hurt me? Can I carry my cross with patience and love, as Jesus did? This Holy Week is an invitation to walk closely with Jesus — from the Last Supper to the Cross and finally to the Empty Tomb. May we open our hearts to God’s mercy, love, and redemption as we prepare to celebrate the joy of Easter. What is my response to Jesus’ love on the Cross? Will I remain with Him or walk away?

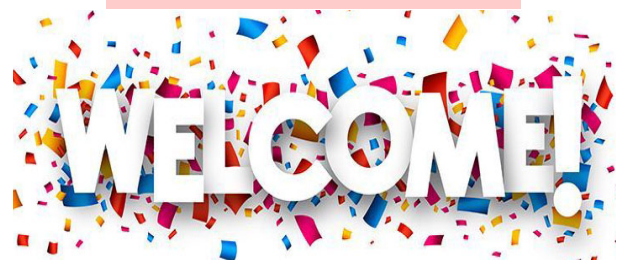
